


to the Reception Class at Macosquin Primary School

Key Information about life at Macosquin

What will my child eat at school?

Children should bring a healthy snack and drink from home to eat at break time e.g. fruit/vegetables/bread-based product/yogurt (no jams/cereal bars etc.) or they can purchase a healthy break from the canteen each day at a cost of 50p (further details to be provided in September). On a Friday, children can bring a break of their choice (does not have to be healthy) in line with our Healthy Break policy.



If there are any specific dietary requirements, please ensure the school is aware of this.

Children can bring a packed lunch or have a **school dinner** at a cost **of £2.60 per day.** The dinner menu is available on the school website http://macosquinps.co.uk/parents-area/dinner-menu/ and also available on our booking system, ParentPay when making dinner bookings.

School dinners must be pre-booked and paid before 2pm the day before via ParentPay.

Our school is a nut free zone- no nut products may be brought into school at any time.

How do I make payments?

We operate a cashless payment system in school. ParentPay is our online payment system which enables you to pay for school meals, trips and extra-curricular activities etc. from home. You will receive information on setting up a ParentPay account from the school office via email before September. If you have any difficulties in accessing ParentPay, please contact the school office (02870344317 or email info@macosquinps.coleraine.ni.sch.uk).

How do I keep up to date?

As well as Seesaw, you can keep up to date with the goings on in school via our school website monthly news and Facebook page. You will find key information including dates, dinner menus and other information on the website. You will see snippets of our learning on Facebook and/or Seesaw.

What if my child is absent or needs to leave school early?

Should your child have to leave school early e.g for an appointment please contact the school office. Your child should always be collected and signed out at the main office. If your child is absent from school, an absence slip should be completed and given to me on the day that your child returns. Please note all absence from school is recorded and any child with less than 85% attendance is automatically referred to the Education Welfare Officer.

How will my child's injuries/sickness be dealt with?

Staff are trained and qualified to deal with sickness and injuries. If your child is particularly unsettled and/or upset, or should they require further treatment, the parent/carer will be contacted.

Should your child have an existing medical condition or develops one at any point and as a result requires the administration of medication etc please inform the class teacher immediately and you will be advised what essential paperwork should be completed.

Pupils who are given prescribed medication from their doctor must have an AM2 form filled out by their parent/carer for this medicine to be administered by staff in school. **Non-prescription medicines are NOT allowed to be administered by staff in school.**

Should your child sustain a bump to the head, the parent/carer will be contacted immediately. It is therefore essential that contact details provided to school care are regularly updated.

Do you have after school provisions?

Yes. We provide After School Care from 12.45pm-5:30pm daily.

Is there anything else I need to know?

Change of clothes — Should your child have any toileting accidents or be wet from water play, we ask that you provide a change of clothes (top, bottoms, socks and underwear) in a labelled bag. This bag will stay in school if a situation like this arises.

School funds are £10 per child or £20 per family per year, payable on ParentPay. This money is used for essential school resources.

What does my child have to wear?

Tracksuits or leggings should be worn. **Please ensure all uniform is clearly named**. Please check names regularly throughout the years as washing tends to cause labels to fade. Uniform is available to purchase from S & T Moore and Heart & Home, Coleraine.

A significant amount of our children's play-based learning is outside and therefore wellies are required and should remain in school:


A waterproof coat should be brought every day.

Learning in the Great Big Outdoors

Learning outdoors is a pivotal place in broadening our children's learning experiences in pre-school. It is the perfect place for each child to explore both authentic and natural materials and where they feel the freedom that inside does not replicate. Learning outdoors is an integral part of our day which will provide endless opportunities for each child to be creative, imaginative, improve muscle strength and motor skills. There may be an odd mucky trouser leg or damp sleeve. After reading these benefits, we can assure you the extra washing is for a fantastic cause!







Playful Learning

Learning through play is at the heart of what we do in reception. We endeavour to deliver purposeful play experiences that teaches each child to 'learn to co-operate and share',' persevere', 'explore emotions' and 'experience the 'exhilaration that exuberant play can bring' (CCEA, 2018). We believe play can achieve many things particularly promoting fantastic language development and concreting early mathematical concepts. It is a process which intrinsically motivates all our children and motivates them to be influential learners for the primary setting. We just love it and so do the children!









Learning Environment

The learning environment is the pinnacle to our children's learning. We are so blessed in Macosquin to have a fantastic range of great quality learning resources which our children just love using. We have a beautiful Sensory Garden, a mud kitchen, sand and water play, outdoor role play and an amazing boat to play on to name just a few of our wonderful resources. We also have a polytunnel where we will have opportunities to see seeds grow into plants.

Encouraging Positive Behaviour in a Nurturing Environment

At Macosquin Primary we aim to nurture each of our children in an open and safe environment to be kind and respectful to each other, to have a love of learning and to work collaboratively. Our team are very focused on each child's happiness and wellbeing in school which we believe will help them achieve their full potential.

Macosquin Primary is a PATHS school and in reception we will be delivering pre-school PATHS, a wonderful nurturing programme which explores emotions, resilience, and relationships.

We will ensure that:

- 🖶 children are actively challenged in their learning.
- golden rules are displayed, used and spoken about regularly with our children.
- children are encouraged to build resilience and develop conflict resolution with support from adults.
- we develop a warm and accepting atmosphere that encourages children to be open, trusting, and honest with each other.





Reminders

These are some reminders of how you can help your child get ready for school.

Getting ready each day, I will need:

- ♣ a lunch box if I am not taking dinner.
- 🖶 a coat with a hood regardless of the weather.
- Change of clothes and wellies (named). These items stay in school)
- School bag (optional). This may be useful for them to carry their artwork and other items home with them.

Please encourage me to:

- begin to learn to dress myself.
- 🖶 look after my own belongings.
- become more independent by encouraging me to tidy away my toys and listen to and carry out simple instructions.
- lacktriangle use the toilet independently.

General Preparations for School

- 🖶 talk about starting school regularly and what to expect/who they will see.
- 🖶 show them and talk about Seesaw, the website and this booklet.
- 🖶 read positive stories about starting school.
- 🖶 allow your child to try on their uniform and organise their belongings.
